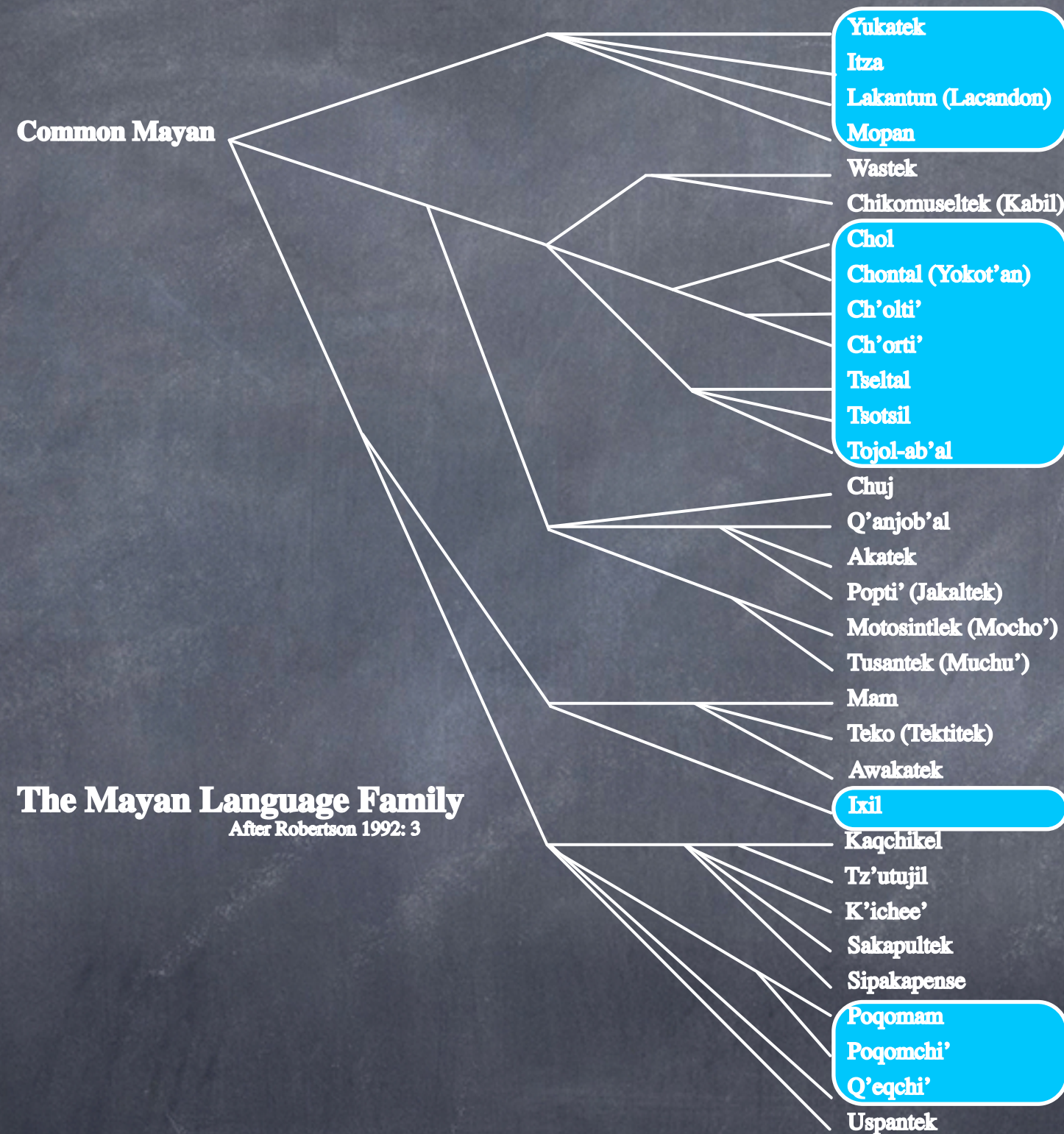

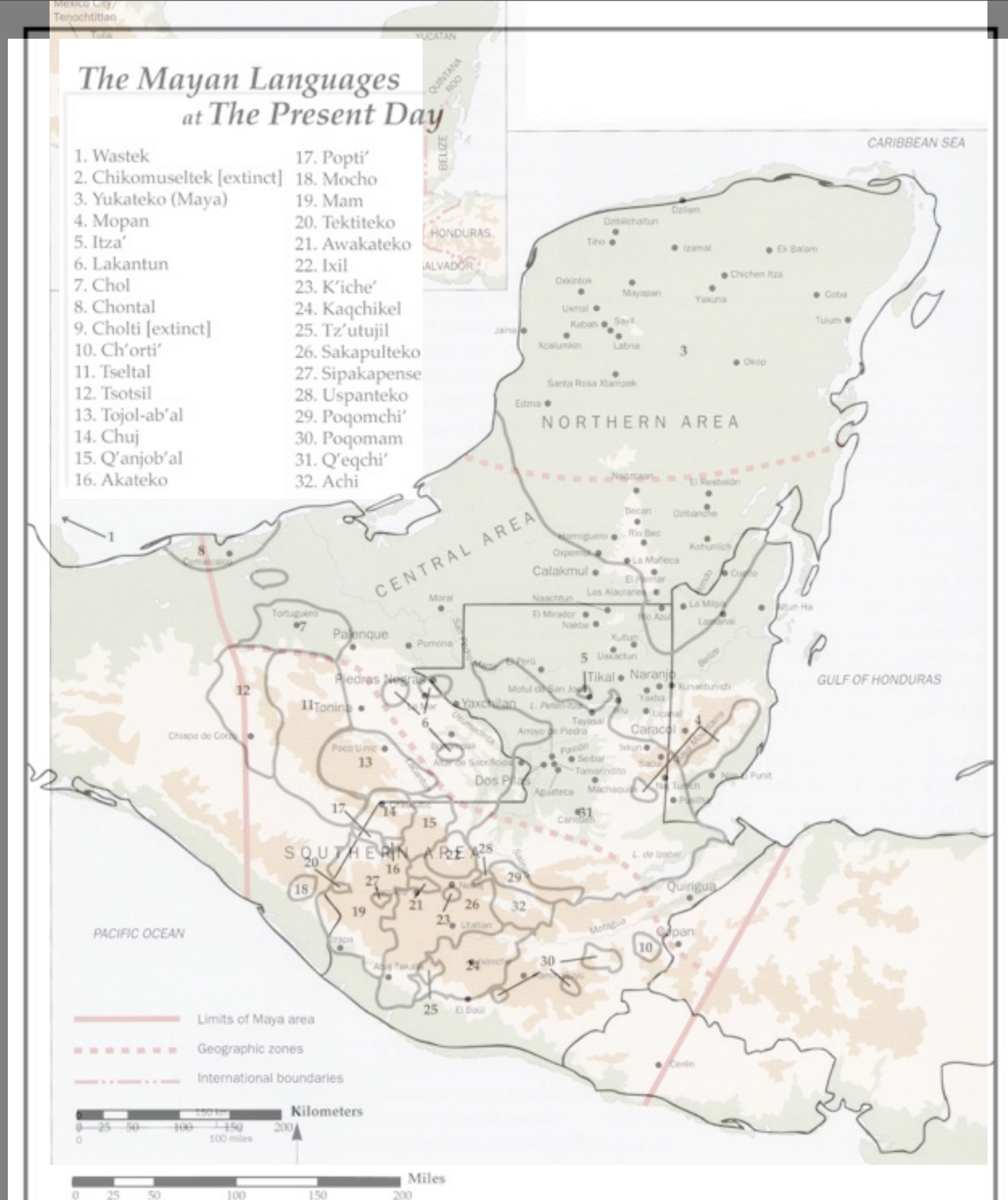




Lowland Mayan Language Contact

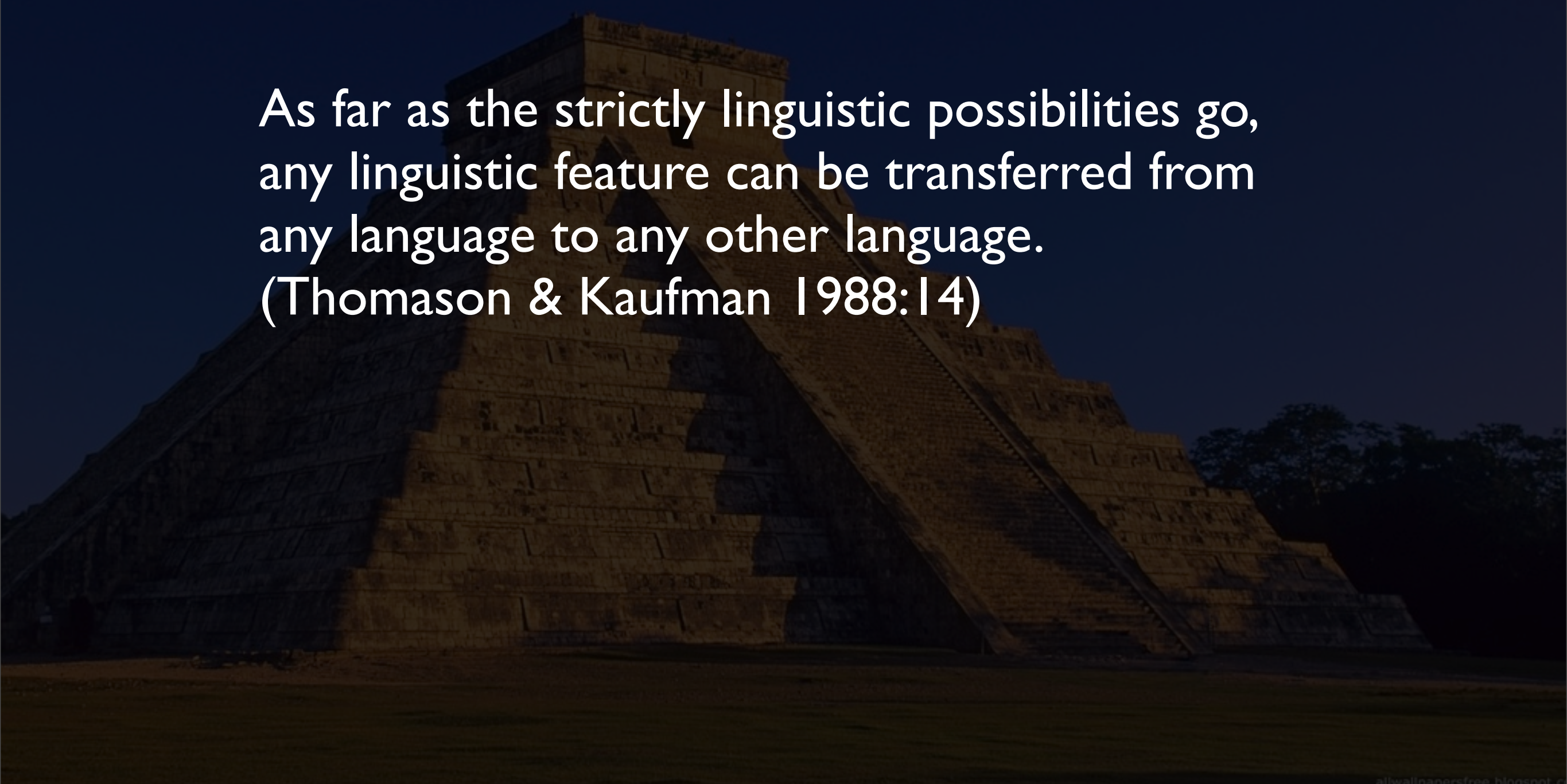

*Constraints on Outcomes of Language Contact

As far as the strictly linguistic possibilities go,
any linguistic feature can be transferred from
any language to any other language.
(Thomason & Kaufman 1988:14)

adverbs > other particles, adpositions >
numerals > pronouns > derivational affixes
> inflectional affixes

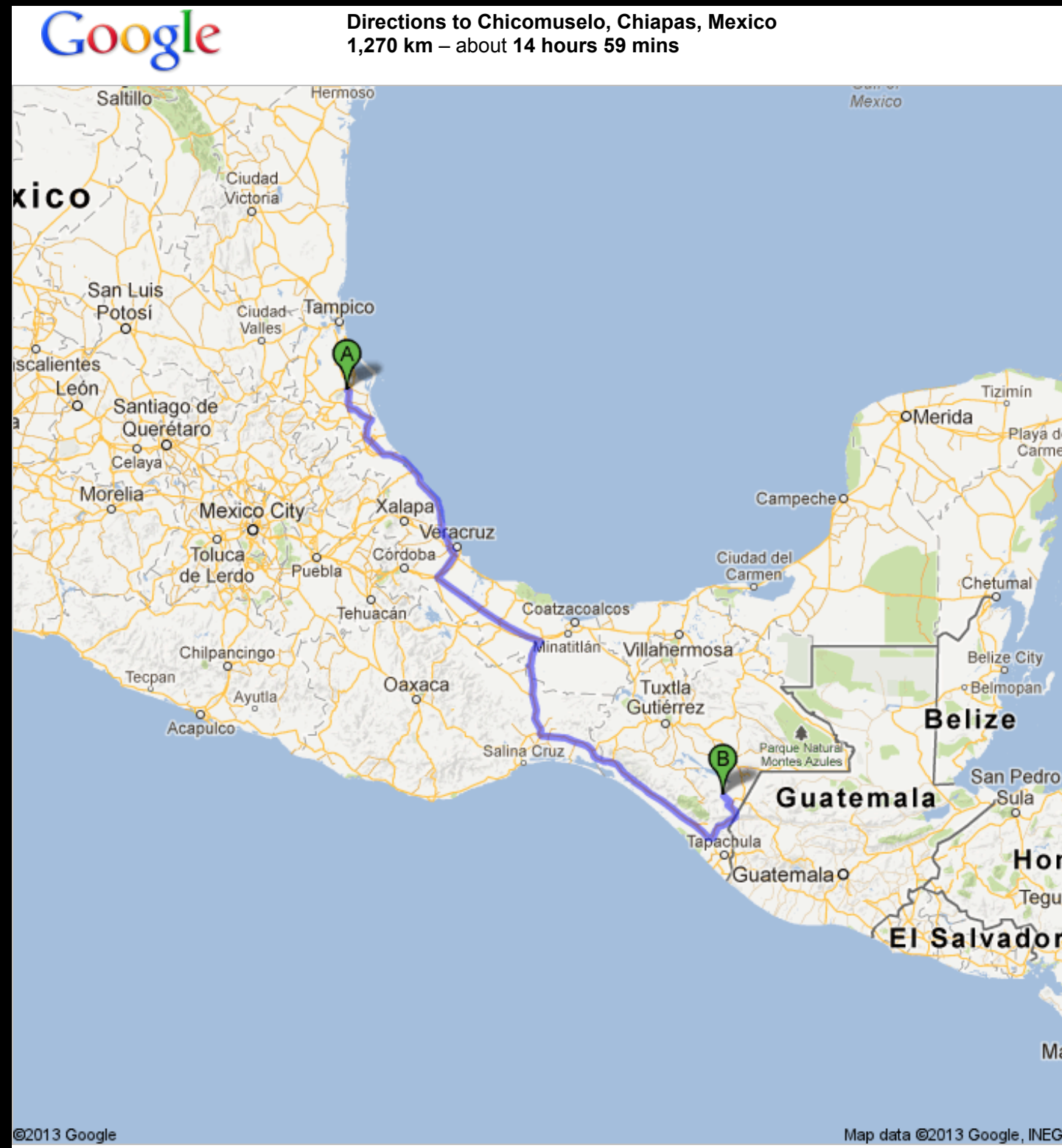

Morphological and Syntactic Innovations

- inclusive/exclusive distinction in first person plural
- expansion of numeral classifier system
- loss of agent focus antipassive construction
- postverbal placement for absolutive person markers
- aspect based split-ergativity (with *-VI nominalizing suffixes)
- plural postclitic -o:bʼ
- perfective marker ti-
- future perfect suffix -o:m
- positional intransitive suffix -tahl (Justeson et al. 1985: 9)
- progressive auxiliary *iwal (Justeson et al. 1985: 9)
- affect verb suffix -na (Justeson et al. 1985: 9)
- Specific numeral classifiers
- specific person markers (nearly complete paradigm)
- agentive relational noun -men(el)

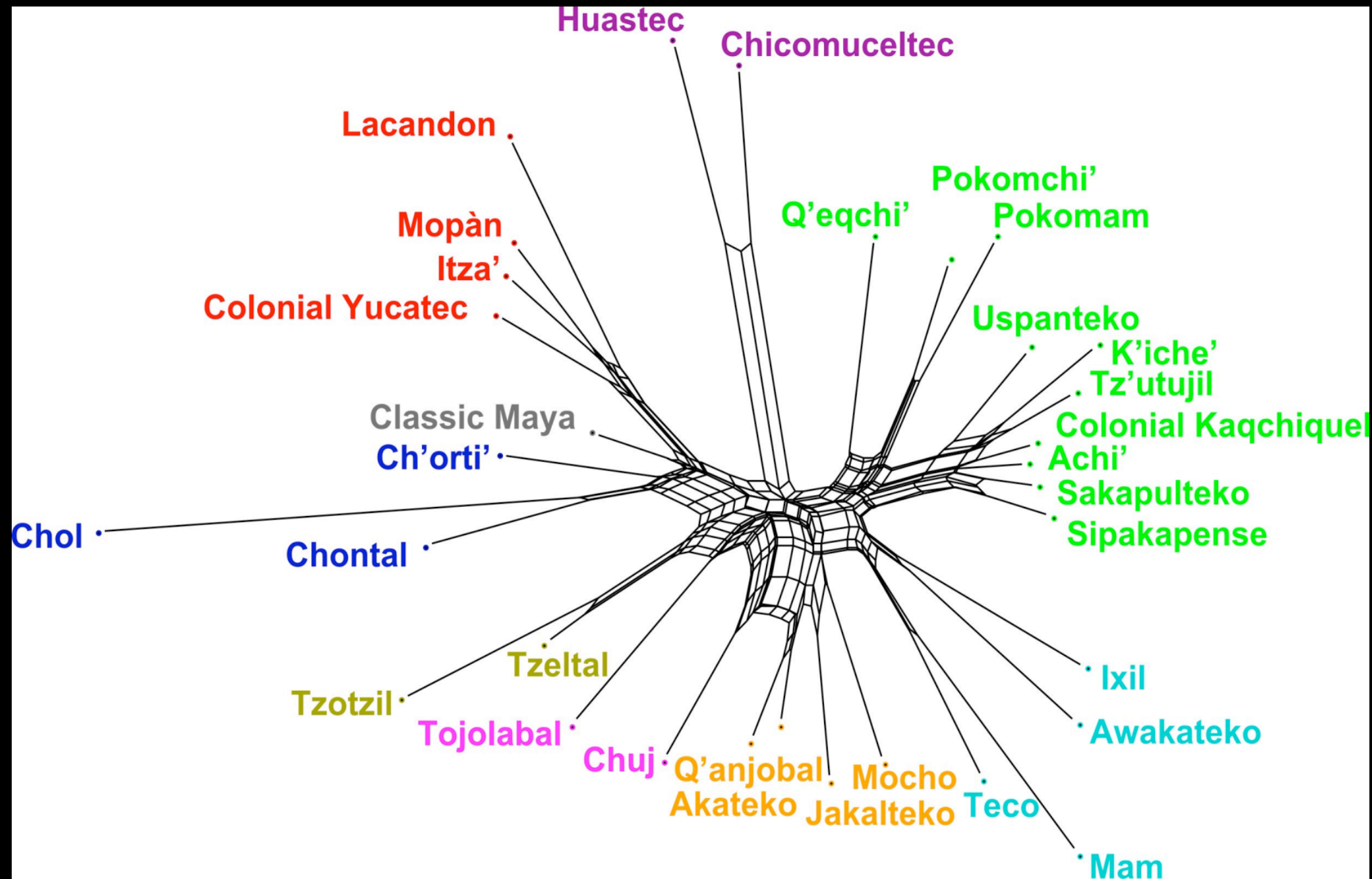
